Between April and July 2015 Stacratchers and the RSNO's production of Hup toured Scotland to venues and communities across Scotland.






We asked for audiences to complete a short survey either online or on paper immediately after the performance. 207 people answered our survey:













How old are they?

Production for the very young tells story without using words

HUP - and away we go, into a forest clearing that's enclosed by cut-out perspex trees. It is home to a mischievous raccoon and it harbours a trio of musicians who will turn out to be every bit as playful (as well as playing violins and a cello).

It is a new collaboration between the Royal Scottish National Orchestra and Starcatchers, especially devised for the very young. The intended age range is up to 24 months, the emphasis on soundscapes, visuals and story-telling which doesn't rely on spoken text. Instead, Hup delivers an adventure in friendship and sharing the joys (and bushy tails) of a raccoon with a love of nature.

Dressed in monotone from the black tip of her nose to her stripey-socked toes, Hazel Darwin-Edwards is an engagingly bouncy critter. (She is also Hup's co-creator along with composer Abigail Sinar). When we first encounter her, she's humming. Soon, she's percussing on the floor and violinist George Smith is picking up the thythm and moving it on, into a tune that has the lilt of a Scottish folk song. As it loops sweetly, a second violin chimes in (Abigail Sinar) and we're beguiled by harmonies. What emerges, with the addition of a cello (Andrew Huggan), is a lovely interaction between musical moods and rhythms and the little games that our lively raccoon initiates - it is a game in itself, spotting the cause and effect nature of the relationship.

Raccoon is cheerfully set on morphing the musicians into fellow furries - Smith introduces a gentle tension by acting the refusenik. He succumbs, as do the tinies, who have infiltrated proceedings in response to peek-a-boo play, or in pursuit of fluffy tails. If half-an-hour seems a test of their concentration, the reward is a constant flow of intriguing activity and enticing music, followed by some hands-on play for all.



Hup - a perfectly tailored work for under-twos. The research and knowhow of pre-school theatre specialists Starcatchers and the talented musicians of the Royal Scottish National Orchestra have combined to give babies and toddlers a delicate introduction to classical music. Two violinists and a cellist are joined by a pesky raccoon, determined to enlist everyone into her black and white briagde. Face paint, false bushy tails and stripy socks are produced from various boxes, while the musicians play Abigail Sinar's gorgeous new score.

What the babies make of it is anyone's guess - those synapses are busy firing away in private behind wide, questioning eyes. Some toddle around the carpeted space, most sit absorbing it all like sponges.

Hup is a short and quietly beautiful piece of bespoke musical theatre for babies and toddlers up to 24 months. There is a delightful atmosphere where participants are invited to sit on golden carpets surrounded by yellow and orange perspex trees from deisgner Karen Tennant. Cocreator Hazel Darwin-Edwards who is dressed as a saucy, slinky raccoon, cuts out paper birds and arboreal 'helicopters' to charm the wee recipients. Once seated, children and their adult companions are treated to some truely lovely music composed by co-creator Abigail Sinar and played on violins and a cello that's accompanied by playful interaction with that raccoon.

There is a necessary narrative that weaves its way silently through this charming experience. Ina reverse of expectations the raccoon gradually persuades the other to join her stripey black and white world, but the gentle brightness of the citrus coloured forest is not dimmed by the string players joing their black snouted, hooped and fluffy tailed chum. *Au contraire!* She does this wil simple recognisable props that effectively bring complete inclusiveness to the musical group - a fine if subtle message for the weans!

Both transfixing and mesmerising, this relaxed and intimate delight of a performance is full of surprises geared right at tiny tots by clever enough to draw in the adults in the room too as it magically links nature and music.

Edinburgh based company Starcatchers specialises in performances for babies and very young children with the aim of nurturing their creative and cognitive development. As an introduction to highly imaginative theatre for this very special group of citizens, Hup absolutely excels.

One fo the greatest pleasures of Xana Marwick's show lies in watching the varying reactions of the young audience as the live music, composed by Abigail Sinar, moves between moods that range from playful to romantic, and the performers dress up and initiate games of hide and seek and pin the tail on the donkey.
